Dear Friends

This is our twenty-fourth newsletter of 2020 – which to my reckoning is 6 months' worth! Quite a time to spend together!

The end of August marks the close of the season here on St Barts, for the island to take some time off to relax a little, repair and regenerate – ready for the new season ... while keeping half an eye out (well probably two) for any storms heading our way.

The majority of the shops, restaurants, hotels and properties on the island are shuttering up for their annual 'fermeture'. Nevertheless, many St Barts residents will be having 'staycations' this year, while others may be venturing to the 'metropole' (i.e. mainland France) or further afield depending on the ever-changing restrictions.

St Bartholomew's Anglican church will equally be taking time to 'recharge its batteries', so both this email newsletter and our Sunday online services will be put on pause for a month or so.

However, we will still hold our **weekly Zoom Coffee Morning fellowship every Sunday at 10am AST/EDT (details below)**. And we will include a few prayers at the outset to allow us to continue our worship together. Do think about joining us, and you might see a familiar face or two.

We will be sending our next email in early October with information about the new season. We will hopefully start to hold services inside the church, welcoming all those present on the island (with social distancing!) ... and we also hope to offer streaming or recordings for you to enjoy, no matter where you are. In November, we will have the Revd John Dephouse, followed by the Revd George Conger – both returning for their second visits.

This week we have the Revd Barbra Robinson celebrating our virtual Eucharist. The playlist starts off with a collage showing our Zoom participants over the past few months, as well as a montage of our visiting clergy – which is my way of thanking them for their dedication and precious time taken to share God's message with us.

I also wanted to say "Thank You" to those who have responded to our past requests for help with our 2020 funding. We obviously appreciate that everyone will be experiencing some economic hardship as a result of the ongoing situation. However, as we have been holding our church services online and the island only had a limited number of tourists, our collection income this year is significantly lower than expected. We would therefore be grateful for your continued support – perhaps making an offering as if you were worshiping with us in Church on a Sunday. This will allow us to keep St Bartholomew's a place of spiritual nourishment.
